

## VOCABULAIRE

The words in the vocabulary list are given in the same form (or one of the same forms) that they appear in in the text of *Presque mort*.

Unless a subject of a verb in the vocabulary list is expressly mentioned, the subject is third-person singular. For example, **appelle** is given as only *calls*. In complete form this would be *she, he or it calls*.

Abbreviations in the list: *adj.* for *adjective, part.* for *participle*.

It is useful to remember that *en* followed by a verb form ending in *-ant* is usually equivalent to English *while -ing*.
